## WASTE PAPER

- File folders (without metal)
- Egg boxes
- Notebooks (without plastic cover)
- Magazines
- Cardboard boxes
- Catalogues (without plastic cover)
- Copy paper
- Fruit cups (cardboard)
- Paper towels (clean)
- Paper bags
- Paper carrier bags
- Paper packaging (coated, with label 'folded for waste paper')
- Boxes
- Freezer packaging (coated cardboard)
- Corrugated board
- Leaflets (without plastic cover)
- Newspapers, newsprint paper, magazines



## COLOURLESS GLASS PACKAGING

- Colourless bottles (glass)
- Colourless glass bottles (disposable)
- Colourless preserves jars
- Colourless preserves jars
- Colourless cosmetics packaging and bottles (glass)
- Colourless jam jars
- Other glass jars



Please **ONLY** put white glass in the white glass container. Just one green bottle is enough to turn 500 kg of glass green.

Drinks glasses, ceramic tableware and vases are not packaging and should be placed in residual waste.



## STAINED GLASS PACKAGING

- Stained glass
- Coloured bottles (glass)
- Coloured glass bottles (disposable)
- Coloured preserves jars
- Coloured preserves jars
- Coloured cosmetics packaging and bottles (glass)
- Coloured medicines bottles



Improperly disposed of colourless glass discolours stained glass and diminishes the quality for recycling.

Drinks glasses, ceramic tableware and vases are not packaging and should be placed in residual waste.



## LIGHTWEIGHT AND METAL PACKAGING

- Blister packaging
- Buckets (empty, packaging)
- Bottles (ceramic)
- Meat trays (polystyrene, plastic)
- Films (packaging)
- Cork(s)
- Plastic cups (packaging)
- Plastic packaging
- Nets (e.g. for fruit and vegetables)
- Foam packaging
- Crates (wood), disposable
- Polystyrene chips, packaging
- Tetra Pak
- Ink cartridges (empty)
- Tubes (plastic, empty)
- Vacuum packaging
- Aluminium foil
- Bottle tops, screw caps (metal)
- Paint cans, spray cans (empty of residue)
- Yoghurt pot lids
- Coffee packaging
- Tin cans
- Meal trays (aluminium)
- Tubes (metal)



## BIO-WASTE

- Twigs, branches
- Pruning waste (shredded)
- Flower remains
- Potting soil
- Eggshells
- Garden waste
- Grass cuttings
- Hedge trimmings
- Hay
- Coffee filters (with grounds), coffee grounds
- Bones
- Kitchen waste
- Kitchen roll (soiled)
- Leaves
- Fruit and vegetable waste
- Sticks (shredded)
- Bark
- Tea bags, filters
- House plants



## RESIDUAL WASTE

- Tarpaulins
- Ash (coal, coke), cold
- Nappies
- Lead crystal glass
- Flower pots
- Printer cartridges (for inkjet printers)
- Buckets (household buckets, no packaging)
- Paint tubs (plastic, completely empty)
- Agricultural and construction foils
- Photographs, negatives
- Watering cans
- Glassware (e.g. drinks glasses)
- Lightbulbs (excluding energy saving bulbs)
- Hair, household sweepings
- Hygiene products (used)
- Cat litter
- Ballpoint pens
- Plastic toys



## RECYCLING CENTRE

- Demolition wood
- Rechargeable batteries
- Out-of-date medicines, pharmaceutical products
- Used cooking oils and fats
- Alloy wheels
- Car batteries
- Car tyres
- Batteries
- Screens
- Electrical appliances
- Energy-saving bulbs
- Paint cans (with contents)
- Window glass
- Thermometers
- Tiles
- Glues, adhesives, adhesive tubes and tins
- Toner cartridges (empty)
